San Francisco Housing Authority – Section 8 Housing Department

Provides permanent low-income housing; residents pay 30% of their income. Priority given to those who work, attend an educational institution, pay 50% or more of their income, and to those who are homeless, veterans, elderly, or disabled.

Operates nine residential hotels. Must be homeless and referred by CAAP or a case manager at one of the following shelters: MSC South, Next Door, Hospitality House, Episcopal Sanctuary, A Man's Place, A Woman's Place. Can also be referred by certain community agencies: ask your social service agency about a THC referral.

Community Housing Partnership

Operates four buildings that provide permanent housing. Applicants must go to Senator Residence at 519 Ellis St, on any given Tuesday, to sign up for an appointment on a first come, first serve basis. Arrive by 6:30am; doors open at 7am. Residents pay 30% of income.

Provides permanent supportive housing on Treasure Island to homeless families that may be dealing with HIV/AIDS, mental illness, or substance abuse. Services include case management, substance abuse counseling, employment training, and programs for children.

Two-year program for families. Applicants must be 6 months clean and sober. Must not have extensive history of violence or sex offense charges. Services include case management, childcare, life skills support, employment services, education training and placement, drug treatment, and housing placement upon graduation.

Four to six-month program for homeless individuals. Begins with two-week case-managed stay at a shelter, followed by entry into STEPS. Clients must be goal-oriented and committed participants. No sexual abuse, elderly abuse, or arson charges. No referral required. Orientations are Monday @ 10am.
